

# New Hampshire Extends Decade-Long Relationship with CNSI

**Rockville, Md.** – CNSI today announced the New Hampshire Department of State, Division of Vital Records Administration (NHDVRA) has awarded CNSI a one-year contract (with optional 2-year extension) to maintain and enhance its Vital Records Information Network – the very system CNSI designed and built for the state beginning in 2004.

NHVRIN also allows users to efficiently perform all vital records office tasks, from the capture or registration of vital events to the creation of statistical reports. CNSI’s updated scope of work will consist of software upgrades and functionality changes to accommodate new data sets.

As a fully web-based platform, NHVRIN has created financial and operational advantages for the state in many ways. The platform allows entities all over the health care spectrum to access and utilize data without software – saving time and money without the burdens of maintenance or licensing. Further, the collaboration NHVRIN permits increases

productivity and efficiency in one of the State's most interconnected industries.

"We're excited to continue our work with CNSI to make New Hampshire's vital records system remain the most capable in the nation." said Stephen Wurtz, State Registrar and Director at NHDVRA.
